# Honoring Rev. Larry Nulisch

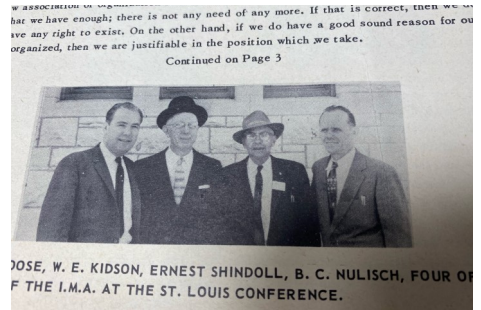

When the IMA gathered for its Annual National Conference in September, there was a moment when special honor was given to a consecrated man of God.

Amidst a heartfelt standing ovation, Rev. Larry Nulisch, Sr. was recognized as the last living witness of the original meeting when ministers met together to propose and vote for a Pentecostal Organization that would honor fellowship and Biblical doctrines.

He was there when the International Ministerial Association was formed. It was 1954. He was 15 at the time. His father, one of the founders, Rev. B.C. Nulisch, Sr., along with Rev. Kidson from Houston, met with about a dozen other ministers at Rev. Ernest Shindoll's church in Dallas, Texas.

Soon after the meeting, Rev. Van Hoose would be visited by Rev. Kidson to establish the foun-



dational process for the new organization, which covered the Northern and Southern States of the U.S.A.

Rev. Larry has been a part of the transformation through the organization's long life. From the beginning, he was serving on the National level for Youth Leaders and was pastor of an IMA church in Dallas while still in his 20's.

In addition, he served 14 years on the South Central District Board as the Secretary/Treasurer and two terms as Chairman.

Throughout his countless years of service, (with many behind the scene) he was instrumental in inspiring thousands of young people toward Christ through many outreaches and activities that he continued to organize. This includes youth conferences, youth events, and youth services locally and nationally.



He gave many young people a place to worship and minister and had a heart to encourage young ministers toward their callings and spiritual goals.



## Rev. Orvil Shindoll

Rev. Orvil Shindoll (pictured above) has been around the IMA since just after its incorporation. He has pastored IMA churches and has been a part of the fellowship for nearly fifty years. He still preaches, sings, speaks at gatherings of tens of thousands of people and hundreds of pastors in the Philippines. He and his wife still travel and support churches in the Texas area and far beyond.



## Rev. Archie Alderson

Rev. Archie Alderson (pictured above) was also acknowledged at our conference. He, his wife, and family initially went to Japan as missionaries in the 1950s. Though now in his 90s, he is soon to return to Japan for a gathering of church leaders that minister there. He plans to join their hearts, unite their potential and commission them as a collective group to be a mighty force in the Orient for Jesus.



## Holy Spirit Encounter

At the close of the message at the missions' service, there was a strong sense of God's Spirit being present. No doubt God was calling the IMA to partner with ministries such as Awe Star Missions to reach Generation Z and Alpha. Rev. David Cook came forward and gave the challenge to respond to the message by coming forward to the altar for prayer. Most everyone present drew near to God, got on their knees, and called upon the Lord. The Holy Spirit then descended upon each of us as He adjusted hearts, stirred emotions and called us to make quality decisions for the Kingdom of God. Many said this was perhaps a Kyros moment when God met afresh with ministers in the IMA.
